

KG Medium Term Plan – All About Me 2025 - 2026

Literacy


The children will actively participate in reciting familiar rhymes and stories. They will expand their vocabulary through exposure to various stories, rhymes, poems, and nonfiction books. Introduction to phase 1 phonics activities will involve relating body percussion to different body parts. Discussions will focus on children's preferences for colors, toys, books, and foods. They will engage in mark-making activities that are related to the topic.

Maths

The children will actively engage in recognising, naming, and matching colors. They will also practice sorting objects based on various attributes such as size, texture, color, shape, and weight. The children will learn to recite numbers from 1 to 5 and participate in discussions about individual items upon request. They will identify and describe attributes such as long, tall, short, high, heavy, and full. Additionally, the children will learn to identify and name shapes such as squares, rectangles, circles, and triangles. They will have the opportunity to play with shaving foam in trays, which will provide a fun and tactile way to practice numbers.

Art and Expressive design

The children will make marks on paper to represent a self-portrait or family poster with pencils, pens, crayons, chalk, and charcoal on different sized, shaped, and textured papers. They will be involved in making collages with different fabrics, papers, foods, and materials. Painting (finger, bubble, hand, splatter) with different sized brushes and different types of paint on different sized, shaped, and textured paper. They will be looking at paintings and other forms of art and discussing content and style.



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Physical Development

The children will engage in various activities to enhance their motor skills and coordination. They will have the opportunity to explore the outdoor play area, where they can enjoy playing with climbing equipment and bicycles, fostering their gross motor skills. Moreover, they will engage in threading beads and constructing with Lego pieces, which will specifically target their fine motor skills. In addition, the children will work on their hand-eye coordination by shaping and manipulating play dough with their hands. As part of promoting healthy eating habits, they will also participate in making fruit salad using child-friendly knives to safely cut the fruits.

Communication and Language

The children will engage in a variety of activities to enhance their language skills and creativity. They will discover and learn different stories, songs, nursery rhymes, and new vocabulary associated with the topic. Using puppets and role play, they will have the opportunity to retell stories, bringing them to life. Through imaginative play and small-world scenarios, the children will recreate existing stories and invent their own tales with new characters. Additionally, they will be encouraged to observe themselves and describe their unique features, such as hair, eyes, nose, and skin, while expanding their vocabulary with words like curly and soft.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

The children will be learning about different emotions related to the topic and sorting objects into 'likes' and 'dislikes.' They will discuss similarities and differences between each other. The children will be encouraged to think about how they take care of themselves and keep themselves healthy and safe. They will explore their own unique fingerprints using magnifying glasses.

Understanding the world

The children will learn about the world around them through fun activities. They will look at picture books, talk to visitors, and learn about daily routines. They will also explore different textures like sand and dough, and use recycled materials to make models. The children will get to know their new classroom and the different places in their school. They will observe and record the weather every day, and have fun creating things with clay, recycled materials, fabric, construction kits, and cooking.
